I understand that it is my responsibility to notify Iowa One Call at 811 to have locates done in the right of way because there could be underground utilities where the signs are being placed. This is to protect myself and others from unintentionally hitting underground utility services that could cause serious damage. I will call at least 3 days before installation.

Sign placement should be top of the back slope 5ft tall. The post must be break away. The sign should face on-coming traffic so motorist can visibly see sign as they approach.
Each owner and each person in the possession or control of any lands within Scott County shall cut, burn, or otherwise destroy all noxious weeds, as listed below, each year and in such manner as to prevent said weeds from blooming or coming to maturity and as often as necessary to prevent seed production:
<u>May 20 to June 5:</u> Leafy spurge, hoary cress, curly dock, smooth dock, poison hemlock, red sorrel, purple loosestrife, and musk thistle
June 1 to June 15: Canada thistle, Russian knapweed, buckhorn plantain, and wild mustard
<u>July 1 to July 15:</u> Field bindweed, horsenettle, perennial sowthistle, quackgrass, velvetleaf, puncturevine, cocklebur, bull thistle, tall thistle, wild sunflower, and teasle
Springtime: Buckthorn (Rhamnus)
